Dear Faithbridge Family,

In recent weeks our newsfeeds have been overwhelmed with acts of violence and murder both locally, the Cities, nationally, and globally. From mass school shootings such as at Annunciation Catholic School in Minneapolis, the stabbing of Iryna Zarutka on a Charlotte subway, to Charlie Kirk's assassination, to Melissa Hortman and her husband being gunned down in their home, to thousands of brothers and sisters killed in Nigeria for their faith violence and death seems inescapable. As the body of Christ, what should be our response and what is our responsibility during this chaos?

Remember and be alert. Our battle is not against flesh and blood but against every principality and spiritual forces of darkness. God is the author, giver, and sustainer of life. He permits evil as part of His permissive will, but it is the Adversary who steals, kills, and destroys. We may not understand God's purpose in permitting these atrocities. However, we must trust that God will use these tragedies for good and that we, as His hands and feet, have the opportunity and responsibility to minister comfort and peace to those who are hurting.

Mourn and grieve. It is completely appropriate to mourn and grieve the loss of life, even the loss of someone's life who is not related to or close to you. In fact, our hearts should break more than they do as disciples of Christ, especially for those who we don't know if they were regenerated in Christ.

Be righteously angry. As disciples, it is good, right, and true to feel anger towards the evil and injustice towards those who commit such evil acts of violence. But we must be careful not to sin in our anger. God is a God of justice, and He is perfectly righteous and holy. He will make all things right. But in our anger, we must not wish harm on those who perpetrate violence, rather we must pray for the redemption of their soul, just as Jesus prayed for His persecutors from the cross, "Forgive them Father, for they know not what they do".

Remain prayerful. This is probably the most powerful response to these tragedies even if there are those in the public sphere and the media who mock it. We cannot limit our prayer to only the victims and their families and loved ones. We must also pray for the perpetrators and their families and those that love them. We need to realize that Tyler Robinson, Charlie Kirk's alleged shooter, has a mom and a dad and a family and friends.

We need to pray for Tyler's salvation and for the salvation of all those who know him, that he and they would come to the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. We can pray for DeCarlos Brown, Jr., the man responsible for murdering Iryna Zarutskya on the light-rail train in Charlotte, that he would have victory over the darkness in his life through the saving power of Jesus Christ. And we must pray for the thousands of others who see violence as the only means of solving their issues or proving their points.

Be hopeful, pursue unity, and avoid division. As disciples of Jesus Christ, our risen Lord and Savior, we must never lose hope that He can and will make all things new. In His steadfast love, mercy, and grace, He has made each of us who believes, a brand-new creation. We were once children of darkness, full of rebellion and enmity towards God and towards each other. But now, we have been called out of the darkness and into His marvelous light, children of God, adopted and redeemed by the blood of Christ. All glory to His Name!

Be willing to risk and take a stand. We must be willing to engage and stand up for what is good, right, and true. But we must stand for what is good, right and true according to God's Word and not what our political or cultural influences would determine for us or pressure us into. We must be willing to take the risk and publicly challenge the culture with the gospel of Jesus Christ. The gospel, and the Church who has been redeemed and commissioned as its champion, is the only hope for our nation and our world.

Stressors of Life for a Missionary

When praying that they will reach an unreached people with the gospel, these are some prayer requests in addition...

- All of the usual – PLUS...
- Driving and traffic, fear of accidents.
- Unknown/undefined and/or changing rules and laws.
- Corruption and unknowns.
- Visa, work permits, government hoops and requirements.
- Lack of trust and need to be constantly “on your toes”.
- Unknown culture rules, language issues.
- Good friends (and kid’s friends) leaving the field, frequent transitions and losses.
- Educational needs for children and schools that don’t support or understand.
- Tribalism and racism.
- Medical and dental issues and finding competent doctors.
- Aging parents thousands of miles away.
- Always noticed, can never hide, stares and various gestures.
- Meal planning – mostly everything from scratch, many familiar ingredients unavailable.
- Children and grandbabies on the other side of the world.
- Wealth disparities and perceived disparities.
- Lack of schedules and long-term planning.
- Worker/repairmen with little or no training (electrical, plumbing, etc.).
- “Compassion Fatigue”.
- Unspoken and assumed expectations.
- Maintaining funding and financial support.
- Mission organizations, churches and supporters expectations or perceived expectations.
- Inconsistent power and water.
- Smoke from burning trash.
- General safety issues.
- Noise – loud bars, parties, Pentecostal churches, mosques.

Fearfully and Wonderfully Made

David, the Psalmist declares, “I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.” (139:14).

The context of this verse is the incredible nature of our physical bodies. The human body is the most complex and unique organism in the world, and that complexity and uniqueness speaks volumes about the mind of its Creator. Every aspect of the body, down to the tiniest microscopic cell, reveals the truth of that.

The following are just a small example of some of these amazing features of this wonderfully-made body:

The human brain attests to our ability to learn, reason and control so many automatic functions of the body such as heart rate, blood pressure, and breathing. It maintains our balance to walk, run, stand and sit, all while concentrating on something else. The brain also has an amazing ability to adapt, no matter what condition is put before us. Information needed for the replication of an entire human body, with every detail covered, is stored in the DNA of the billions of cells in the human body. Each cell, once called a “simple” cell, is a tiny factory not yet fully understood by man.

Consider the single fertilized cell of a newly conceived human life. From that one cell develops all the different kinds of tissues, organs, and systems, all working together at just the right time in an amazingly coordinated process.

Further, the body’s immune system is able to fight off so many enemies and restore itself from the smallest repair (even repairing bad portions of DNA) to the largest (mending bones and recovering from major accidents). We have no idea how many times through a lifetime that our immune systems have saved us from certain death.

The function of the digestive tract and the related organs, the longevity of the heart, the formation and function of nerves and of blood vessels, the cleansing of the blood through the kidneys, the complexity of the inner and middle ear, the sense of taste and smell, and so many other things we barely understand—each one a marvel and beyond man’s ability to duplicate.

Truly, we are fearfully and wonderfully made. How grateful we are to know the Creator and to marvel not only at His knowledge, but also at His love. (Psalm 139:17-24).

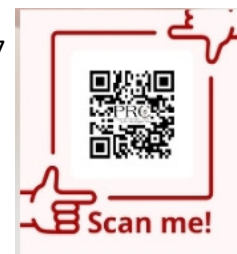

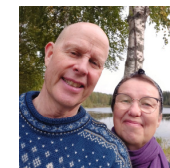
