Dear Faithbridge Family,

What's that? Spring is in the air? That's great news! You know what else is great news? The gospel of Jesus Christ! That *God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son that whosoever believes in Him will not perish but will have eternal life* (John 3:16). The message of God's redemptive love is one that we who have received that love should never tire of sharing with as many people as we have opportunity to share it with.

But the good news doesn't end with our belief in Christ and His death, burial, and resurrection. That's actually the beginning of a full life, an eternal life, of growing as an apprentice of the Lord Jesus Christ. We just wrapped up a series called Level Up! Taking Our Next Step of Obedience in Following Jesus. In the series we looked at the functional great commission of attracting, connecting, and serving in combination with the actual Great Commission of being called, equipped, and sent to multiply apprentices of Jesus throughout our community and into our world.

To that end we also explored the four distinct roles of an apprentice of Jesus that we believe that God is calling Faithbridge to develop and multiply. An everyday apprentice of Jesus at Faithbridge is called to be a Joyful Apprentice of Jesus (Upward), a Generous Friend to our brothers and sisters in Christ (Inward), a Compassionate Neighbor to those we do life with outside of the church (Outward), and Courageous Investor in one or two people to grow together in our apprenticeship of Christ (Forward/Multiply).

Over the course of 2026, and beyond, we plan on providing training and equipping opportunities to learn and grow in those four areas of everyday apprenticeship. Some of those training environments may look like an Adult Bible Class on Sunday mornings, an evening seminar during our Wednesday night programs while FSM and Awana are going on, or a Saturday learning laboratory. Stay tuned and pay attention to the bulletin or Sunday announcements for those opportunities as they come online.

Brazil STS (Simply The Story) Report from Lorelei Polley

"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."
 Ephesians 2:10

The LORD had a delightful assignment prepared for me on my way to Sao Paulo, Brazil!

On my Denver to DC flight, I was seated next to a man from Syria. He had attended an evangelical school in Syria as a child and he made it clear he is not a Christian. But, he did want to talk about Bible stories he had learned in that school! Talking about Bible stories = my sweet spot!!

But first the LORD had to get me to Denver on Saturday – instead of Chicago on Friday. He used:

- *a snowstorm in Chicago to cancel my 1st flight
- *mechanical issues with a 2nd plane that would have taken me to Denver Friday night
- *an overnight stay in Fargo so I arrived in Denver on Saturday

As the Denver to DC flight landed, I asked the man from Syria if he knew the true story of Naaman the leper from 2 Kings 5:1-19. He did not. I told him enough of the story to hook him – including the fact that Naaman was a Syrian! I encouraged him to read/listen to the story and ask what he could learn about the little girl in the story. (Spoiler alert: she's an amazing picture of forgiveness and grace.)

How cool is God to have a story about a Syrian army commander in the Bible for this man from Syria who is obviously seeking the Lord?! I continue to pray for his salvation, asking God to bring other believers into his life.

Although I arrived in Brazil a day later than planned, it didn't impact the training. The STS training was the first segment of an Oral Bible Translation course that 15 people had just begun. STS, as an oral Bible study method, is a perfect fit with the work they are doing.

A simple explanation of their work is that they learn the language of people groups who do not even have a written language, let alone a Bible. Then they translate the Bible into that language, and record the Bible onto solar-powered audio players. This allows much quicker access to the Bible for these people groups.

During the STS training all of our small group leaders were Brazilians whom we had previously trained. During the week, their leadership skills improved and time was saved since translation was not needed in the small groups.

Many more YWAM bases throughout Brazil are learning about STS and requesting trainings. Brazil has quickly won my heart! I look forward to God opening the door for me to do more STS trainings there.

LONELINESS—A SURPRISING HEALTH RISK

The loss of a close friend or loved one, a move to a new area, retirement — these are just a few of the common situations that can trigger intense feelings of loneliness. Isolation, for whatever reason, can have some profound health effects on the young and old alike.

Experts suggest that we may experience disconnectedness now more than ever, despite advances in technology. Cellphones, email and social media have been taking the place of face-to-face interaction in many instances. We were not created by God to remain alone. We need each other!

Research has suggested that the effects of prolonged loneliness may increase your chances of premature death by 14 percent— even more than obesity. Lonely people quite often have fragmented sleep patterns which can have a profound impact on your health. A poor diet consisting of too much “comfort food” can have negative effects on your health in the long run. These things can trigger changes that increase inflammation in your body, which may in turn, exacerbate conditions such as arthritis and heart disease. Add to this the growing threat of depression and suicidal tendencies.

Here are a few suggestions to help lift yourself out of loneliness...

- * Nurture your friendships by reaching out with a call just to say hello; be positive and interested in what’s going on in your friends’ lives; extend and accept invitations; respect boundaries and don’t overtax others with your needs.
- * Attend community events within groups of people with similar interests to yours.
- * Consider volunteering your time at a hospital, church, museum or library.
- * Take up a new interest or take a walk.
- * Think beyond two legs— pets of all types can make wonderful companions.
- * Last, but not least, being part of a local church family and strengthening your faith in God can give you a sense of true and lasting belonging.

While the health benefits of friendships are considerable, time spent alone can also be a valuable asset. Use this time to be productive or to invest in yourself— recharge, pursue a solitary hobby, pray/meditate, indulge in a day-dream or even plan how to pursue that dream in the future. A good life is about having a balanced perspective— a little alone time is good for the soul, but too much of it can result in undesirable health consequences.


